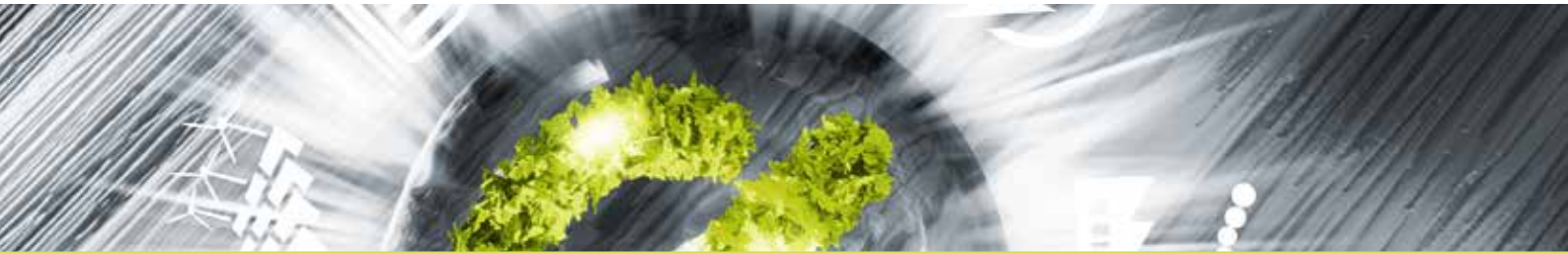


ENERGY SMART GRANTS SCHEME:

REDUCING COSTS BY CUTTING ENERGY USE

Carbon Smart is a comprehensive low-carbon support and energy efficiency grants programme for small and medium sized businesses across Derby and Derbyshire



Energy audits and grants are available to help small and medium sized businesses prioritise areas of their premises or activity where energy costs can be reduced through energy efficiency measures. Measures can include the installation of energy efficient technologies (e.g. LED lights, heat pumps), renewable energy generating technologies (e.g. ground source heat pumps, solar panels), or more energy efficient equipment (e.g. machinery, air compressors).

Our team can work with you to help you identify the most effective measures for your business:

- » our energy audit can be used to inform a grant application and formulate an investment or business plan for energy efficiency within the premises;
- » we facilitate grant applications for up to £15,000 towards the cost of installing energy efficiency measures to improve the energy efficiency of premises, processes or equipment;
- » please note that businesses will need to provide 50% of the total cost of the proposed project.

Businesses will also need to meet the funder's eligibility criteria to qualify for support.
